Dr. Henry J. "Hank" Winton, N9GWF

Dr. Henry J. "Hank" Winton, a father, grandfather and retired professor of electrical and computer engineering at Rose Hulman Institute of Technology, passed away peacefully on Saturday, June 21, 2008, in Terre Haute. He was a graduate of Purdue University, where he was a member of Tau Beta Pi and Eta Kappa Nu, and was secretary of the student branch of the Institute of Radio Engineers. He also earned masters and doctoral degrees in electrical engineering from the University of Illinois and Santa Clara University, respectively. The results of his doctoral research were used by NASA to refine the design of spacesuits. Dr. Winton served in the United States Navy during the Korean War as electronics officer of the destroyer, USS Gyatt (DD-712), and as the assistant electronics material officer for the supervisor of shipbuilding, Chicago, where he was responsible for the installation of electronics equipment aboard all ships and amphibious craft being built in the Great Lakes area. He was a senior member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, life member of the Friends of Music of Indiana University, and a member of the American Society of Engineering Education, Terre Haute German Oberlandler Club, American Radio Relay League, Wabash Valley Amateur Radio Association, U.S. Sailing Association, Columbia Club of Indianapolis, and St. Stephen's Episcopal Church. A 34-year faculty member of Rose Hulman, Dr. Winton was responsible for development of laboratories for control systems, digital electronics and digital signal processing, and for many years was faculty advisor to the student branch of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers. He also served as professor-in-charge of the Electrical Engineering Department for three years in the 1970s. Published: June 23, 2008 11:52 P.M. -From Trubune Star

and 20 meters were the ones I remember most. Rod also was a weather spotter from time to time for Illiana Skywarn. Yep, he would haul himself into his car, using his hands and arms, and away he would go.

Diabetes and other ailments would take control of Rod's body over the years, but not his spirit.

Rod would ride his wheelchair to the car (and later his specially equipped van), get into the van, store his chair, go to the grocery store, unfold his chair, do the shopping and do the same thing for the trip back home. Rod had tools and ways to get things done without the benefit of legs.

He was a fabricator, a welder, worked on the family cars, did a good deal of work on his house, built and maintained some of his own amateur equipment, and did the soldering for me and lots of others, because he was better at it than any one else in the north part of the county.

Antenna parties, oh yes! He was never able to climb a tower, but his expertise was invaluable and no one did a better job at coax ends than Rod.

An Elmer, most certainly. Rod taught code, loaned or gave away equipment to help some new or older ham to get on the air and someone's rig was always on Rod's bench for repair.

Rod's son Bill, KA9TLU, can be heard on 2 and 440 and some times on the low bands.

After 72 years of life, Rod went home to be with his Lord. His family will miss him and his friends will remember, "WB9MGB, mighty good boy".
