

FUTURE SITE OF THE WVARA

Dreams of a permanent home for the WVARA came closer to reality with the recent acquisition of a parcel of land on the southeast side of Terre Haute. The property is located about 50 yards south of the intersection of 25th Street and Margaret Avenue. The road running south from this intersection becomes Sidenbender Road, which provides a northeast boundary for the triangularly shaped parcel. On the southeast side the property borders Thompson Ditch (which runs parallel along the north side of the railroad). And on the west side a brick paved road runs nearly the entire length of the property line.

The property, just shy of 4 acres, is mostly wooded but has a 30 foot wide swath cleared along the entire northeast side next to Sidenbender Road. With the maintained grass right of way of Thompson Ditch on southeast side, and the brick road along the west side, it's easy to walk the entire perimeter of the property.

The photo above is a view of the southeast side of the property, taken from the south side of the railroad along Sidenbender Road. The property line runs from the road (in the right side of the picture) to a point between the two utility poles (in the left side of the picture).

The aerial image on the next page views the parcel from the north side looking south. In that photo the brick road on the west side becomes hidden by the tree canopy, but extends straight south nearly to the clearing along Thompson Ditch.

Think we can get away with using that nice concrete parking lot on the west side of the road?

TERRE HAUTE NORTH HIGH SCHOOL AMATEUR RADIO CLUB - K9THN

There are twenty-seven students currently involved in amateur radio activities at THNHS during this school year. Five senior students received instructions in radio theory and practice during the first trimester and were tested for Technician licenses before Christmas. One student passed the test and was assigned the call sign KD9FDY. Thus fourteen students have earned licenses so far during the two years that the K9THN club has been in existence. Instructions will continue with a wider student base during the remainder of the school year with another test session scheduled before school ends in May.

Twelve students were assigned to work on radio projects during the second trimester. When the students returned to school in January following Christmas break, they immediately began setting up a satellite antenna tracking system to be installed on the outside wall of the school directly above the ham station inside. Unfortunately, the weather did not cooperate, and the installation has been postponed until warmer weather arrives.





In the meantime, the students are getting ready for the School Club Roundup contest which occurs during the week of February 8 - 12. Be sure to listen for them on the bands and give them a contact.

SEVERE WEATHER SPOTTERS' TRAINING CLASS

March 7th 2016, 7:00 PM Berean Baptist Church 6770 North Clinton Street Terre Haute, IN

The National Weather Service Indianapolis office, in conjunction with Illiana Skywarn, is sponsoring a Severe Weather Spotters' Training Class. The class will take place on Monday, March 7, at 7:00 P.M., EST at the Berean Baptist Church, 6770 North Clinton Street, just south of Sky King Airport, just north of Terre Haute.

This two-hour class is designed to train all emergency and/or law enforcement personnel, teachers, students, scout troops, as well as the public in how to properly identify and report severe weather events to the National Weather Service. These events include hail, damaging winds, funnel clouds, tornadoes and other weather phenomena related to severe thunderstorms. This class is free and open to the public. Seating is available on a first come, first served basis.

The main presenter will be David Tucek, Warning Coordination Meteorologist for the National Weather Service in Indianapolis.

Since 1974, Illiana Skywarn has used Amateur Radio to exchange timely severe weather related information with the National Weather Service office in Indianapolis. Amateur Radio operators work in conjunction with the National Weather Service, through the Skywarn program, to report severe weather events as they are happening. Information is used in conjunction with weather service radar data to issue weather warnings to protect the public.

A talk-in for amateur radio operators will be on the 145.23 and the 444.600 Skywarn system.

Ever use a headset?

Last Field Day was the first time I had ever used a "headset". By headset, I mean headphones with the attached microphone, with either a hand switch or a foot switch to key the mic. (I understand you can also use VOX keying, but my habit of cursing at "lids" makes that option way too dangerous.) The rig I used was set up with a foot switch which threw me for a bit of a loop. I had always keyed the mic with my hand -not my foot! So I ended up holding the foot switch in my hand and keying as I would with a hand held microphone. Dan, NW9N, caught me a few times speaking into the foot switch like it was a microphone, but he was polite enough not to laugh out loud.

Anyway, with this experience I decided that a headset was kind of neat, and I ended up getting one for my rig at home. Although I don't use it all the time, I find a headset very handy in running a net or working a contest. However, I still don't use a foot switch. But I might give it another try one of these days.
