
Christmas Party, Santa A. T. M. Cap Off Year!

General Meeting Minutes 12/02/05

The December 2, 2005, WVARA Club Meeting was called to order at 7:11 p.m. by Club President Gary Adams, W9EEU. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Vice President Don Pine, K9DRP. Those present introduced themselves with name and call sign; there were no new or upgraded licenses reported. **Announcements**: (1) Board meeting will be held immediately following the Club meeting. CAARLA/QCWA meetings will be held prior to the WVARA Christmas party on December 10. (3) VE testing will be held Sunday at the Red Cross. (4) The WVARA Christmas party will be held December 10 at World Gospel Church at 6:30 p.m.; the meal will be at 7:00 followed by grab bag gift exchange (\$5 limit). (5) Santa at the Mall will be December 17; see John, N9YRX, if you can help with that. (6) Eastside Outdoor Ham Club will sponsor a hidden transmitter hunt, December 18, at 2:00 p.m. at Hawthorn Park. (7) Dave, N9FMD, announced that space is available if anyone is interested in participating in the Abbottville NIMS training this Saturday and Sunday from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Contact Dave, N9YNF, if interested. (8) Ryves Hall's annual Christmas party will be December 22; Jim still needs assistance communication for that event. There were no questions or corrections to the **Secretary's Report** so they will stand as published in The Bandspread. Chuck, W9COD, presented the **Treasurer's Report** with a balance of \$4,302.74 in all accounts. Chuck moved that it be approved as presented; Ray, K9DUR, seconded the motion. The motion passed. There was no old business discussed. New Business: (1) Election of Officers: Dave, N9YNF, was in charge of ballots. He advised that only full members are eligible to vote. The slate of officers presented by the Nominations committee was as follows: Gary Adams, W9EEU -President; Don Pine, K9DRP - Vice President; Debbie Shorter, KC9AOR - Secretary; Chuck Procarione, W9COD - Treasurer; Kevin Berlen, K9HX and Jim Osburn, WD9EYB - Trustee. There were no nominations from the floor. Ray moved and Steve, WB9WVG, seconded the motion to close nominations. There were 46 ballots cast. Dave, N9YNF, reported that Gary, W9EEU, was elected President; Don, K9DRP, Vice President; Debbie, KC9AOR, Secretary; Chuck, W9COD, Treasurer; Kevin, K9HX, Trustee. (2) A repeater upgrade proposal was presented by Kevin, K9HX. The proposal is to add a second receiver at the WTHI TV tower, which won't necessitate an additional antenna. A voter will have the ability to monitor up to four channels, which means we can add two additional receiver sites later. The benefits would be (a) move our coverage area east; (b) mitigate problems we are having with the current receiver. Each receiver will be PL toned. The best signal will be transmitted. The cost is estimated to be \$1,500 - \$1,700; the cost for each additional site would be between \$700 - \$1,000. Dave, N9FMD, moved to approve the upgrade at a cost of no more than \$1700; Jim, WD9EYB, seconded the motion. The motion carried. (3) A check of \$100 was presented

to Jim, KA9DIF, for Ryves Hall. The money came from donations from Club members to assist with the KC9EKW ham station at Ryves Hall. Jim thanked the members and reported on the progress being made on the station. Following a break, the half pot drawing was held and won by Debbie, KC9AOR. The program for the evening was the Club Auction with Kevin, K9HX, as the Auctioneer. The meeting was adjourned at 9:25 p.m.



Additional NOAA Warning Coverage for the Terre Haute Area

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), National Weather Service offices in Lincoln, Illinois, and Indianapolis, Indiana, have teamed up to provide additional NOAA All Hazards Radio coverage to the Terre Haute area. "We have added watch and warning information to the NOAA weather radio in Paris, Illinois," said Ernie Goetsch, Meteorologist in Charge at NOAA's Lincoln, Illinois Weather Forecast Office. "This will enhance the National Weather Service's ability to alert residents to life threatening weather affecting Vigo County and Terre Haute," added Goetsch. "Our mission is to protect life and property," said John Ogren, Meteorologist in Charge at NOAA's Indianapolis weather forecast office. "By broadcasting Indiana warning information from the Paris, Illinois, NOAA weather radio transmitter, we enhance the service of watch and warning dissemination."

"Existing NOAA weather radio broadcasts will continue without change from the NOAA radio transmitter in Putnamville, Indiana," said Dave Tucek, Warning Coordination Meteorologist of NOAA's Indianapolis Weather Forecast Office. "So NOAA All Hazards radio owners in Vigo County should listen to whichever broadcast comes in strongest while residents of other counties served by the Putnamville transmitter should continue using those broadcasts," Tucek added. NOAA radio broadcasts from the Paris transmitter will continue with current and forecast weather data and watch and warning information for east central Illinois originating from the Lincoln, Illinois, Weather Forecast Office.

Added to the broadcast are all types of watches and warnings affecting Vigo County, Indiana, originating from the Indianapolis Weather Forecast Office. Service also includes alarms for warnings for tornadoes, flash floods and severe thunderstorms. The alarms instantly activate NOAA radio receivers and programmed Emergency Alert System equipment used by the media.

"NOAA All Hazards radio are a great lifesaving device and would make a great Christmas gift," said Keith Reedy, WA9DRO, Amateur Radio operator and Illiana Skywarn Coordinator. "Adding broadcasts of Vigo County warnings from Paris, Illinois will benefit everyone here and assist us in our volunteer storm spotter operations for the National Weather Service," added Reedy. The Paris, Illinois, NOAA radio transmitter broadcasts on a frequency of 162.525 MHz. The Putnamville, Indiana NOAA radio transmitter, broadcasts on a frequency of 162.400 MHz. All NOAA radio transmitters serve locations roughly within a 40 mile distance of the radio transmitter. 
