Important Equipment Check

Local hams launched an unscheduled "fox" hunt last week, after apparent technical problems caused the Club 2 meter repeater to re-transmit periodic APRS data transmissions for more than four hours. The problem serves as a good reminder for all hams to check the operation of their equipment, especially in the case of transmitters that are not normally listened to.

In the case of APRS transmitters, location information is received by a GPS satellite system, converted to an audio signal, then sent to a 2-meter transmitter. That transmitter is also keyed by the navigation system, so a signal is transmitted about every 60 seconds or so. Specific frequencies are set aside for such use, but these frequencies are not often monitored by the human ear. The problem causing this interference was easily solved, and the repeater returned to normal service.

The incident should remind us once again of the importance of keeping a close eye on any equipment that transmits a radio signal.

BTW, this includes that sneaky little device called a "mic" which likes to hide underneath stuff on your car seat. If you aren't aware of its location, it may be retransmitting every little syllable, word or inadvertent "expletive deleted" that you may utter as you are nearly hit by another careless driver.
