Hey Chuck! How much ya chargin' for coax these days?

After listening to many conversations on the repeater it's clear that a number of our members are local merchants. That is, they deal commercially with the public, some of whom are hams.

While we have yet to hear any conversations that actually violate federal law against doing business over the air, we've heard a few which have come uncomfortably close. This could especially be a problem for someone like Chuck, W9COD, for example, who actually sells Amateur Radio related equipment. But it applies even to non ham-related items.

The FCC rules in this regard are applied fairly liberally nowadays but we don't want to put any local merchants in an awkward position. An inquiry as to when Chuck might plan to be in the store at any given time is always okay as is a general discussion of equipment that someone might need for a project. Where it perhaps begins to get into a questionable area might be asking him if he has a specific item in stock or if your order is in. A simple, "Do I need to come to see you?" would get around this. Better yet, a cell phone call to him would solve the problem if you don't want to wait until you or he gets home.

We don't think that Chuck or any other merchant wants to stop talking Amateur Radio on the air. But let's not put them in a compromising position. As the old saying goes, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure!" -ed.
