level of damage caused by a disaster such as flooding, tornadoes, or other disasters. The viewer was to rate each building shown as:

- affected (still habitable)
- •Minor (habitable with minor repairs)

• Major (habitable only with extensive repairs) or... • Destroyed (bulldoze)

We had to guess, from a photo of each building, how it had been evaluated. It was fun, only because they weren't *our* buildings; imagine what the owners felt!

## ARES Gears up for National Level Exercise, May 17

Coming to your area soon is the National Level Exercise 2011. This is a simulated earthquake that is going to be along the New Madrid fault line and is going to be affecting Terre Haute and all surrounding counties.

Vigo County ARES will be participating in the exercise on May 17<sup>th</sup> from 7:00 A.M. till 7:00 P.M. and will he handling communications for the entire county.

The event will be as follows; earthquake hits and we have a total loss of all communications in the county. This is 800 MHz system and VHF systems are down as well as all phones both cell and land line. ARES will provide communications for the county and to make contact with the state EOC. All of this will be handled by Amateur Radio.

After the devastating earthquake in Japan, the need to be prepared is greater than ever.

We will need all the help we can get for this event and we need people to come to the ARES meetings to get the training they will need to be ready to handle the volume of traffic we will be handling that day.

We are also going to have to supply some support for Clay County as they have asked for our help as well. This is going to be an "All hands on deck" kind of event and the ham community has been called up to provide for the area and we need to make a good showing to prove once again that when needed, ham radio can and does work.

In looking towards this year hams have been asked to help more than ever, we are going to be working the County Fair and working the Shied Diesel truck event. In addition, we have been invited back to help with the National Night Out event that we did last year.

One more event that I can think of is the Homeless Bound walk that we did last year and we have been asked to help with that again this year.

If that is not enough for you then we have the Red Cross. They are interested in working with us as well.

I feel that we are starting to get some of the respect that we deserve and we just need to make sure we do not let the agencies down.

#### Yaesu Temporarily Suspends Production After Earthquake

All Vertex Standard employees and their families are said to be safe.

Production of Yaesu radios at Vertex Standard's factory in Fukushima, Japan, has been temporarily halted due to earthquake damage.

In an open letter to the amateur radio community, Vertex Standard CEO and President Jun Hasegawa expressed his gratitude for the many "kind words and thoughts about us during this difficult time." He reports that all Vertex Standard employees and their families are OK, although the company has not been able to reach its many dealers and subcontractors located near the coast. "We just hope that they are alive," he writes.

Hasegawa also reports that the Yaesu factory in Fukushima suffered "minimal" damage from the earthquake but has been temporarily shut down nonetheless. He says he expects it to be back in normal operation within one to two weeks and asks for everyone's understanding and cooperation.

At this time, there have been no public reports received from any of the other Japanese amateur radio manufacturers.

Over the years, Jack has participated in numerous license classes, and presented several programs for WVARA club meetings. His presentations are always very interesting, and well done. He always manages to include enough humor to keep everyone interested in the subject he is presenting.

#### Ted Brentlinger Recounts the History of the Brentlinger Award

Uncle Bill Brentlinger died a few months before I was born.

Both uncles had been wheel chair bound since middle school.

Professor Ted Hunter, at Rose Hulman, received a grant to teach Amateur Radio to handicapped people. Uncle Bill was chosen as his first pupil.



He successfully passed what was called the "C" (Conditional) license.

Bill died in 1935, shortly before I was born.

Then Jack got his license. This was where 'Little Teddy' got 'the bug'. Jack needed help with National HRO receiver with its knobs to turn, plug-in coils to switch and taps on the long



wire antenna - things Jack physically could not do. He was active on 160 & 10 and plus 40 meter phone and CW. The transmitter was a homebrew by Herman Moench and Ted Hunter, who, at the inception of the Brentlinger Award, were the first two honorary recipients of the award. And the rest is history!

#### Our Speaker for the Evening, John Sauer

John is currently maintenance supervisor at Union Hospital, in Clinton. However, in previous life, he was (PSRT) Presidential Senior Radio Technician, the highest level communications non-commissioned officer in the White House, serving for 10 years under presidents Reagan and then Bush.

He said it was a very demanding, stressful, and yet rewarding job. The competition to attain that position is fierce and once one gets the job, the expected level of performance is above any other related job in the public sector, there being no room for error. Since there was zero tolerance for mistakes, one could find one's self out of the position for the slightest of infraction.

Although it is sometimes said that the president 'goes on vacation', in fact, he is president twenty four hours a day for four years at a time. The president and his advisors must always be available by communication both to and from the White House, twenty four/ seven. And, therefore, so was John.

He was responsible for providing communications for the president whether it local or worldwide. While sometimes they had weeks of preparation time, it was

not uncommon to find himself having to set up communications with only hours, or even less, of notification. And again, there was no margin for error.

He reluctantly took the job in the first place and is now glad he did, but he finds it more satisfying to look back on the job rather than forward to it.

There were numerous anecdotes, and personalities to 'flesh out' the talk which we don't have room for here. There were also numerous photos, one of which is shown below.

It was a very interesting talk. Thanks, John, for sharing your story with us. -ed.
