Weather Spotter Class

The National Weather Service Indianapolis office, in conjunction with Illiana Skywarn, is sponsoring a Severe Weather Spotters' Training Class. The class will take place on Monday, March 12, at 7:00 P.M., EST at the Berean Baptist Church, 6770 North Clinton Street, just south of Sky King Airport.

This two-hour class is designed to train all emergency and/or law enforcement personnel, teachers, students, scout troops, as well as the public in how to properly identify and report severe weather events to the National Weather Service. These events include hail, damaging winds, funnel clouds, tornadoes and other weather phenomenon related to severe thunderstorms. This class is free and open to the public. Seating is available on a first come, first served basis.

Our main presenter will be David Tucek, Warning Coordination Meteorologist for the National Weather Service in Indianapolis.

Amateur radio operators, a talk-in will be on the 145.23 Skywarn system.



The W.V.A.R.A. annual club Hamfest is, in my opinion, the second most popular club event of the year. Second only to Field Day, the Hamfest generates more interest and participation for several reasons. Aside from the obvious financial gain, most hams accumulate gear as time goes on and so what can you do with stuff you no longer need or are unable to use? Well, you can

ask your buddies; sell it on eBay..... OR you can take it a Hamfest. Those that have enough extra gear may have enough to warrant their own table. Otherwise there is sure to be someone's table you can put your stuff on. Ham radio gear is often so specialized that parts can be unavailable as a new item. Other gear may be too old to have available parts. In any case, if it is whole gear or just parts, your best source for unique stuff is a Hamfest. Hams often have to search outside their own area for specialized stuff, so Hamfests have become events all over the country and occur at all times of the year.

Many of you have been to the Dayton Hamfest, which is considered the largest in the country. It was my personal favorite as well as my introduction to Hamfests in general. Besides the huge indoor area which surrounded a basketball court, the parking lots outside were quite literally a field of tents and booths



containing everything even remotely related to Ham radio. You could spot the seasoned Hamfest visitors by the backpacks and other gear. The time required to walk past all the vendors and booths took more than a few hours and even days to complete. Hams came from all over the country to buy or sell things. One man's junk is truly another man's treasure.

Unlike the Dayton Hamfest, the local club Hamfest does not require special walking shoes, rain gear or rolling gear bags. But it will have some commercial vendors as well as parts and used equipment.

General Meeting Feb 3, 2012

The General meeting of the WVARA was called to order on Friday, February 3, 2012, at 7:00 p.m. by President Steve Shorter, NT9T. Vice President, Chuck Procarione, W9COD, led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Introductions were There were no new or upgraded licenses. made. Announcements: (1) General Upgrade Class starts Tuesday, February 7, at 7:00 p.m. at Glas-Col. (2) WVARA has a new and improved web site thanks to K9DUR. Everyone is encouraged to check it out. (3) Hamfest & Computer Expo will be held on Saturday, March 10, 9:00 a.m. -2:00 p.m. at the Indiana State University Dede Activity Center. Vendor set up will be 6:00 a.m. -9:00 a.m. (4) The Brentlinger Award Dinner will be posted on the WVARA web site as soon as the date is confirmed. (5) The Board Meeting will be held following the General Meeting. Everyone who is interested is invited to attend and input is welcome. (6) Illiana Skywarn will be holding a Severe Weather Spotter Class on Monday, March 12, at the Berean Baptist Church. (7) QCWA Meeting will be Saturday, February 11, at Pizza City, at 1:00 p.m. (8) The CAARLA meeting will be on Saturday, February 11, at 12:00 Noon. (9) There will be a WVARA testing session on Saturday, February 11, at 9:30 a.m. at Glas-Col in Terre Haute. (10) 60 meter regulations have been published in the Register and go into effect on March 5. Changes are posted on the ARRL web site. (11) The April meeting of WVARA will be on April 13 (the second Friday of April) at the Vigo County Dispatch Office. Because this is a controlled environment we will gather and enter at 7:00 p.m. as a group. We will tour the facility and a short business meeting will follow. (12) Ron, KC9EPZ, announced that the Super Bowl game will be secured and monitored by the Indianapolis Ham Radio Club. (13) Chuck, W9COD, announced that there will be a weather spotter class in Vermillion County in April. Date and details will follow. Secretary's Report: The Secretary's Report will stand as published in The Bandspread. Treasurers Report: Jeff, AB9WR moved his report of \$12,873.58 in all Club accounts be accepted. Ron. AB9GI, seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Old Business: (1) Chuck, W9COD, had flyers for the Hamfest and Computer Expo available and asked everyone to take several to distribute in various locations. He also asked for volunteers to help work the gate. Several vendors from Collinsville will be coming thanks to Dominick, KA9RDK. A total of 28 tables have been reserved to date.

New Business: (1) Chuck, W9COD, gave an overview of projected income and expenses for 2012. Line items discussed that will need to be added to the budget include expense for 3 computers and surge protector for the Club Station and expense for insurance. The revised budget will be published in March and voted on at the March meeting. (2) Meeting adjourned at 7:44 p.m. A program on Grounding presented by Kevin, K9HX, followed this meeting.

Board Meeting Minutes 2/03/2012

The WVARA Board met on Fri, Feb 3, 2012, at 9:28 p.m. Members present were: Steve Shorter, NT9T, President; Chuck Procarione, W9COD, Vice President; Jeff Mitchell, AB9WR, Treasurer; Ann Mitchell, KC9RBF, Secretary; Kevin Berlen, K9HX, Past President; Gary Adams, W9EEU, Trustee; Ted Brentlinger, K9SGL, Member at Large. Joe Cloutier, KC9JAC, and Mike St. Clair, N1WVU, also attended. Secretary's Report: The Secretary's Report was approved as printed in The Bandspread. Treasurer's **Report:** The Treasurer's Report was presented in the form of a motion by Jeff with a total of \$12,873.58 in all accounts. Chuck, W9COD, seconded the motion. Motion carried. Old Business: (1) Repeater Upgrade . Kevin, K9HX, checked with Jerry, K9AF, about whether WVARA might use the THRC's antenna system as a part of our repeater upgrade. He said that was not a problem. The THRC has a receiver that is operating off frequency to the point that it has been shut down. WVARA has a piece of equipment that we are not using that he would like to make available to them which would allow them to get back on the air. Steve, NT9T, was in favor of loaning the equipment to THRC. No objections were voiced. We would retain possession in the event that we would need it in the future. Kevin, K9HX, also reported the findings of his research regarding our options for upgrading our repeater and the costs associated with each of those options. (2) Hamfest and Computer Expo. We are still waiting for paperwork from the insurance company. Will set up an appointment with ISU as soon as contract is in hand. Advertising flyers have been prepared and are being distributed. (3) Promotional Operating Events. Family Learning Day has shown the best response in the past. Other venues will be investigated. (4) Communications Trailer. The trailer is functional but still needs some minor work. One good work day should put it in good order. (5) Radio Vehicle. Kevin, K9HX, stated that liability insurance is less than \$150/year. Steve, NT9T, asked the Board about putting this insurance in as a line item in the budget. The Board agreed to add a line item in the amount of \$150.00 for this purpose. (6) Audit Committee members are Jeff, AB9WR; Steve, NT9T; and Mike St. Clair, N1WVU. An additional member will be appointed by Steve, NT9T. (7) Annual events were updated and discussed as a reminder for any preparations which may be necessary. (8) Brentlinger Dinner will be held on Saturday, March 17. St. Ann's Fellowship Hall has been reserved by Ted, K9SGL. We will gather at 6:30 p.m. and dinner will be served at 7:00 p.m. The speaker for the program will be Jack Diehl. (9) Field Day Planning. Nothing new to report. New Business: (1) 2012 Budget will be prepared and printed as amended. (2) Meeting adjourned at 10:40 p.m.
