With this attached to a hand-held radio, Ted is much more effective checking in from a portable location. Ted also shared some sort of a crank-charged flashlight, but I don't think that was homebrew. Chuck (W9COD) shared a homebrew double-bazooka antenna. Chuck made the center connector using PVC pieces. He featured a flat surfaced cap on the bottom making it much easier to mount the PL259 connector, and a curved surface cap on the top for better rain protection. Chuck had drilled a hole in one piece of the PVC body, and once all connections were secure, he filled the body with auto-body fiberglass for weatherproofing.

After much deliberation (just kidding) the panel declared that both Ted and Chuck were winners with their respective projects. Ron (AB9GI) then used the whiteboard to show a directional sloper antenna system. This led to a great discussion of antenna systems. Awesome job guys, and we look forward to many more homebrew projects in the coming months.

FCC Releases NPRM

The FCC adopted a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) on Monday, October 1, 2012. The introduction from the NPRM is as follows:

In this Notice of Proposed Rule Making and Order, we propose to amend Part 97 of the Commission's Rules regarding administration of examinations and examination element credit for licenses in the Amateur Radio Service. Specifically, in the Notice of Proposed Rule Making (NPRM) we propose in response to a petition for rulemaking filed by the Anchorage Volunteer Examiner Coordinator (Anchorage VEC) to grant examination credit for expired amateur operator licenses, instead of requiring former licensees to retest. In conjunction with this change, we propose to shorten the grace period during which an expired amateur license may be renewed and to revise the vanity call sign system correspondingly. We also propose to reduce the number of volunteer examiners needed to administer an amateur license examination, and we seek comment on amending the rules to permit remote test administration. Finally, in response to a petition for rulemaking filed by the American Radio Relay League, Inc. (ARRL), we propose to amend the Amateur Service rules to allow amateur stations to transmit certain additional emission types, but we deny ARRL's request for a blanket waiver pending the resolution of the rulemaking proceeding.

One thing the FCC omitted from the introduction, but put in the document later, was a correction from when the morse code examination was eliminated. It seems the changes that were adopted were "inadvertently" omitted from the publication, and therefore never went into effect. Technically any upgrades to General class or above without passing the morse code examination were not valid. Thankfully the FCC intends to correct this omission and recognize such upgrades as valid.

FITSAT-1 Deployed From ISS



FITSAT-1 was deployed from the ISS on October 4. FITSAT-1 is a small artificial satellite developed at the Fukuoka Institute of Technology in Japan. Nicknamed "NIWAKA", FITSAT-1 is a 10cm cube weighing in at 1.33kg. The main mission of FITSAT-1 will be to demonstrate a 5.8 GHz high-speed transmitter, which can send a jpeg VGA-picture (480x640) within 6 seconds.

NIWAKA will be performing another experimental mission, which could provide for some interesting observation. It will be sending optical communication by sending morse code using high intensity LED's. The high power LED's will be driven with more than 200W pulses, and should be observable with the unaided eye, or with small binoculars. Hopefully the orbit of NIWAKA will bring it over the Midwest on a clear night and we can witness this interesting experiment. If anyone finds information about an observable pass in our area, make a post to the WVARA list sharing the information for the group.
