
FCC No Longer Routinely Mailing Paper Licenses

Effective February 17, 2015, the FCC will no longer routinely mail paper copies of licenses for any wireless radio service, including amateur radio licenses.

Licensees can still obtain an official paper copy of their license by any of the following methods:

- Log into the ULS and download/print their license.
- Log into the ULS and change a setting requesting to continue receiving paper copies of their license.
- Include a valid e-mail address on the Form 605. A .pdf file of the license will be e-mailed to them.

This change will impact the procedures the VE teams use to validate an applicant's existing license
