Dan Hunter NW9N and Dick Wood N9TH Honored with IRCC Outstanding Indiana Amateur Achievement Award

This year the IRCC honored Dan Hunter and Dick Wood as recipients of the Outstanding Indiana Amateur Achievement Award. The work that Dan and Dick have done with the Terre Haute North Amateur Radio Club was recognized by the IRCC in presenting this award to Dan and Dick. The following is a recap of IRCC Chair Doreen Everett's article in the section newsletter:

This year the IRCC broadened the scope of the Amateur of the Year Award after reviewing the history and intent of the Amateur of the Year award. The original goal for the award was to each year recognize an amateur from Indiana that made a contribution to the amateur radio community during their amateur radio career, but over the years the award has recognized an outstanding contribution made by an amateur during the previous year.

This year the IRCC returned to our roots for the guidelines for the award, but still would allow nomination for an amateur that made an outstanding contribution. We had three great nominees: Douglas E Oldham, KB9SZS and a joint nomination of Richard Wood, N9TH, and Daniel Hunter, NW9N.

Richard Wood, N9TH, and Daniel Hunter, NW9N received the 2015 IRCC Outstanding Indiana Amateur Achievement Award. The presentation was made at the IRCC Forum at the Indianapolis Hamfest, July 11th. Richard Wood, N9TH, was first licensed in 1964. Wood holds an Extra class license and despite being almost totally deaf, Dick is an avid CW operator, and is usually the highest-scoring operator at the WVARA Field Day. Daniel Hunter, NW9N, earned his license in 1993 and holds an Amateur Extra class license. Dan is partially paralyzed due to a stroke, but does not let that inhibit his participation in all aspects of the hobby.

These two members of the Wabash Valley Amateur Radio Association took on the project of starting an amateur radio club at Terre Haute North Vigo High School. Initial contact with the school was made during the 2012-2013 school year. At the school's club fair at the start of the 2013-2014 school year over 30 students signed up, and the Terre Haute North High School Radio Club was born.

Dan and Dick enlisted the help of the electronics teacher, Jeff Hammers, who agreed to serve as the club sponsor. During the course of the school year, Mr. Hammers realized how well the material for the Technician class amateur radio license fit in with the state-mandated curriculum for his class, and has now incorporated the Technician license into his lesson plans and gives extra credit to any student who gets an amateur radio license. One of Dan's favorite sayings is, "We are teaching them science and they don't even realize it". Dan and Dick are at the high school at least three times a week working with the students. Currently, they are helping the students design and put together a satellite-tracking antenna system so that they can make contacts with the ISS and with other amateurs using amateur satellites.

Realizing that the high school club only has the students for a couple of years, they have taken the first steps to establish a club at Woodrow Wilson Junior High School, one of the three junior high schools that feed Terre Haute North HS, so that they can instill an interest in amateur radio in students at an earlier age. They

already have enlisted Ross Cadick, N8CVX, to serve as the club sponsor. Ross is an 8th grade history teacher at Woodrow Wilson and has obtained permission from the principal to install a radio station in the school. Dan and Dick are active members of the WVARA VE Team and they both serve at nearly all of the VE sessions held by the WVARA throughout the year.
