High Altitude Balloon Project Update Tom KD0CGO

We did launch the balloon on Sunday morning around 7:15am EDT. It is also interesting to note that it was May 6th that the Hindenburg caught fire and crashed in NY 80 years ago. I was unaware of this until I heard it announce on NPR while preparing to launch the balloon!


Like we had practiced, we connected the Faraday radios before launch and ran them while we preparing other aspects of the balloon. Based on our testing, we never had any problems with the Faraday connection after the first minute or two. By running Faraday for an extended time before launch, we were able to establish a certain level of confidence in the connection on the day of the launch.

Once the balloon had been filled up, we did a systems check of the payload. After all physical and wireless connections were checked, we powered the GoPro and siren we attached to the payload. Then we released the payload and hopped in the cars.

After about 5 minutes in the air, we lost connection with Faraday and were never able to reconnect. The antenna on the vehicle was the antenna included with Faraday mounted to the top of the chase vehicle. We also built a 915Mhz Yagi, but actually had better luck with the mag-mount since it was outside the car. While we were not able to determine why we were not receiving data, we do know that the payload Faraday was still transmitting because we were able to see it on the SDR we had with us. We were able to see the regular pulsing of Faraday for at least 50 minutes until LOS when it dropped below the noise floor.

Since we did not have data for most of the flight, we were not able to determine the landing location of the payload. We would have continued to the simulated landing area of the payload, but we changed our minds based on some of the data we received from the first few minutes of Faraday. The actual rate of ascent was determined using the data from Faraday. The lower than anticipated lift was significant enough to move the estimated landing spot of the payload to somewhere deep in Kentucky. Since we had lost data connection and only had the simulation to guide us, we decided to turn back.

That was the end of the story until Monday when I received a call from a woman in Kentucky who kids had found the balloon in their front yard when playing. The balloon landed in Brandenburg, KY, just on the other side of the Indiana border. Not only did she give the club a call, but went out of her way to get the payload returned to us safely! Today, we pulled the video off of the GoPro and got some great photos. Unfortunately, it looks like the GoPro camera stopped recording at an altitude of around 30k feet. We believe this can be attributed to the temperature, since the GoPro restarted itself once on the ground. Below are some frames from the camera. In the next few days we will have the video files online so anyone can view them.


Once again, your club will be participating in Field Day. The dates are June 24 & 25, 2017. Set up is Friday, June 23, 2017.
