I was sitting across the table from the boy and watched the wonder in his face as he spoke with Dave. He was bright and well-spoken for a 10 or 11-year-old. After a while he looked at me and ask "How do I end the conversation?" I told him he could say he had to leave and he enjoyed the chat and that is what he very politely did. Watching the boy during the QSO I had the hope that we planted a little seed that would grow into a career in science, technology, engineering or math. We will probably never know what happens to that boy, but if there is even a small chance that we made a difference it was well worth the effort.
