Dear Dr. Elmer

I was listening to a conversation recently, and both stations were putting in good signals to the repeater. Then another station came on during the conversation and then the repeater interrupted the station that was talking and put through the third guy. When he stopped talking, the repeater went back to the original station, who was still talking. Why is this?

The problem you are describing is unique to FM radio, and is called "capture effect." This means that the radio will listen to the stronger of two stations if they are on precisely the same frequency. In the case of a repeater this is happening in the repeater receiver, not your radio. That receiver is sending the stronger station to the repeater transmitter, and that is what you are hearing. In the conversation you described, apparently the second station was stronger then the first. The capture effect can also occur in your radio if your conversation was on simplex instead of the repeater. There is no adjustment to solve this problem, only the requirement for stations to talk one at a time.
